Package inclusions do not always meet the special needs of travelers with limited mobility or severe allergies. DAY 1 Monday, September 15: Depart for Italy
Depart Evansville Reginal Airport for Italy. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the transatlantic flight.

DAY 2 Tuesday, September 16: Welcome to Rome! Assisi

Arrive at Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way Tour Manager as we exit from Customs and Baggage luggage, and meet our Peter's Way lour Manager as we exit from Customs and Baggage Claim. Board our private touring bus and we'll be on our way to Assisi (2.5-hour drive). Upon arrival we'll visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great basilica built in 1569 and crowned by Alessi's magnificent dome. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered; the place where Clare received the habit from Francis; and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where the Saint died. We will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Santa Maria degli Angeli.** After Mass, check-in at our hotel in Assisi.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Assisi.

DAY 3 Wednesday, September 17: Sites of St. Francis and St. Clare
Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis. After Mass,
our local guide will take us to explore the basilica complex, which is composed of two
churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower basilica dates from 1228 to 1230, and is richly decorated with beautiful stained-glass windows and paintings by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper basilica, built from 1230 to 1253, we will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint. Continue to visit the Basilica of St. Clare, the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement. View her remains and see the miraculous crucifix. We'll also have the opportunity movement. View her remains and see the miraculous crucifix. We'll also have the opportunity to visit the Chiesa Nuova, the home and cloth workshops of Pietro Bernadone and Lady Pica (St. Francis' parents), the home of St. Clare's parents, the Bishop's Palace, or the Sanctuary of the Renunciation, a part of the Church of St. Mary Major. The tomb of Bl. Carlo Acutis is in a sanctuary located on the spot where a young St. Francis of Assisi is said to have cast off his rich clothes in favor of a poor habit. Pray near the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis, who had a passionate devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Independent lunch. Free afternoon to explore Assisi on your own. Perhaps you would like to walk to visit the Main Square, Roman sites, places important to St. Francis and St. Clare's youth, or go shopping.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Assisi.

DAY 4 Thursday, September 18: San Damiano | Montefaco Wine

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll visit San Damiano, a favorite retreat of St. Francis and his followers. We'll walk along a trail between olive groves and sheep pastures to the old monastery. Here, St. Clare founded the Order of the Poor Clares and performed the most famous of the miracles. In 1240 on a Friday in September, she turned away an attack by Saracen soldiers who had broken into the convent cloister by showing them the Sacred Host.

Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of San Daminano. After our visit and Mass, we'll continue to visit a local winery, La Tenuta Di Montefaco, for wine tasting and lunch.

Return to Assisi and enjoy a free afternoon. Perhaps you would like to take a hike or a taxi ride to visit Eremo delle Carceri, the Hermitage of the Carceri, where St. Francis and his followers prayed and meditated on Mount Subasio.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Assisi.

DAY 5 Friday, September 19: Orvieto | Florence
Breakfast at our hotel. This morning we'll leave Assisi for Orvieto, an Etruscan city located in the scenic region of Umbria. Upon arrival we'll visit Orvieto Cathedral, where the Eucharistic miracle of Bolsena is conserved. The miracle took place in 1263. After confirming the authenticity of the bloodstained corporal, Pope Urban IV instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi. **Celebrate Mass at the Shrine.** Independent lunch and free time to browse around. We'll leave Orvieto and drive through Tuscany to the Renaissance city of Florence. A stop will be made at Piazzale Michelangelo, one of the best viewpoints in Florence to appreciate the panorama of the city. Picture opportunity. Continue to our hotel for check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Florence. (B,D)

DAY 6 Saturday, September 20: Highlights of Florence | Rome
Breakfast at our hotel. Our local guide will take us to visit the beautiful Piazza Del Duomo
and the delicately patterned green, white, and pink Cathedral of Santa Maria Del Florence crowned with Brunelleschi's magnificent; Giotto's Bell Tower; the Romanesque Baptistry of St. John with Ghiberti's exquisite bronze doors, which Michelangelo called the "Gates of Paradise"; and the 13th century Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross, which holds the tombs of the greatest of Florentine men. Celebrate Mass at the Franciscan Church of Santa Croce. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we'll provide tickets to visit the Uffizi Galleries (with headset or whispers). The gallery building was constructed between 1560 and 1580 and designed by Giorgio Vasari. It is famous worldwide for its outstanding collections of ancient sculptures and paintings from the 14th-century and Renaissance period, including the work of masters like Giotto, Botticelli, Leonardo, Raphael, Michelangelo, and Caravaggio. After our visit, we'll leave Florence for Rome, the "Eternal City." Hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 7 Sunday, September 21: Mass at St. Peter's Basilica | Papal Angelus at St. Peter's Square | Imperial Rome
Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll walk to St. Peter's Basilica for Sunday Mass.
Proceed to St. Peter's Square in time to attend the 12:00 p.m. Angelus (Papal Blessing). Independent lunch. We'll be transferred to visit the Church of St. Peter in Chains to see the original chains in which St. Peter was brought captive to Rome. In the same church, we'll also see the statue of Moses, one of Michelangelo's greatest masterpieces. Then, we'll continue to the ancient Roman Forum. See the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to the outside of the Colosseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue to the grandiose white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See Trajan's Column and the Market.

DAY 8 Monday, September 22: Papal Basilicas of Rome | Scavi Tour Breakfast at our hotel. The main distinction of the Papal Basilicas is that they each have a special "holy door," which is opened only during Jubilee years. Begin our day with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (432-440 the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixfus III (432-440 A.D.). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics depicting scenes from the Old Testament. View relics of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem and the high altar, which contains the remains of St. Matthew the Evangelist. View the icon Salus Populi Romani, Protectress of the Roman People, believed to be painted by St. Luke. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Mary Major. Continue to the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, the first Christian church to be consecrated. It was founded by Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and home to popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. From there we'll pass by the Holy Stairs, said to be the steps on which Christ walked on His way to Pilate's palace. If time permits, you can go up on your knees as thousands of pilgrims have done in reverently recalling the sufferings of Christ. Then, we will visit the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, which houses fragments of the true cross brought to Rome by St. Helena, mother of Constantine. Independent lunch.

Optional Scavi Tour (subject to confirmation): The Scavi, or Vatican Necropolis, is the underground excavation under St. Peter's Basilica. In 1939, Pope Pius XII ordered an excavation beneath the grotto of St. Peter's Basilica, where many popes are buried. Among the tombs of pagans and early Christians, far beneath the high altar of St. Peter's, excavators found a shrine amid the rubble. Most scholars concur that the small column is part of a second-century A.D. shrine built by Rome's small Christian community on the site where St.

Remainder of the afternoon at leisure to explore the sights, sounds and tastes of Rome all on your own! Perhaps you'll buy religious articles in preparation for the Papal Blessing at the audience on Wednesday. Visit the Colosseum or the beautiful and lively Piazza Navona, with time to browse through the artists' stalls to buy a painting and sample one of Rome's most famous products, a tartufo at the Gelateria Tre Scalini. Rome is yours!

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 9 Tuesday, September 23: Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica | Vatican Museums & Sistine Chapel | Walking Tour of Historic Rome After early breakfast, we will be transferred to St. Peter's Basilica. Enter through the Holy Door to receive a plenary indulgence. Celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter (subject to confirmation) or one of the Grotto Chapels. After Mass we will visit one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk through the Sistine Chapel and see the frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End

frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End our morning with a more detailed guided tour of St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Pray at the tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. In your free time, you may wish to return to the Vatican Crypt to pray near the tomb of St. Peter. Return to hotel. Independent lunch.

After lunch, we'll go on a walking tour and experience the best of ancient Rome. Begin at the Pantheon. Built more than 1,800 years ago, the magnificent Pantheon still stands as a reminder of the great Roman Empire. The name Pantheon refers to the building's original function as a temple for the gods. When approaching the front of the Pantheon we can still see the original Latin dedication by Marcus Agrippa. Continue to the Church of San Luigi dei Francesi to see the stunning interior, which is home to a trio of Caravaggio masterpieces. Then we'll walk to the Trevi fountain and Piazza di Spagna, one of the most famous squares in Rome. See the Fontanna della Barcaccia (Fountain of the Old Boat) in the middle of the in Rome. See the Fontanna della Barcaccia (Fountain of the Old Boat) in the middle of the piazza and enjoy the view from the famous Spanish Steps.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 10 Wednesday, September 24: Papal Audience | Free

Breakfast at our hotel. Option: Attend the morning Papal Audience at St. Peter's Square. Pope Francis will greet pilgrims, deliver his message, pray the Pater Noster, and bless religious articles. Independent lunch.

Free afternoon for optional independent day trips outside of Rome or exploring the city. Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 11 Thursday, September 25: Basilica of San Lorenzo | St. Paul Outside-the-Walls | Catacombs of San Sebastian | Pontifical North

American College Farewell Dinner
Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll visit the Basilica of San Lorenzo outside the Walls. The basilica is one of the Seven Pilgrim Churches of Rome and one of the first seven deacons of Rome, who was martyred in 258. The relics of many saints, including Saint Justin, Saint Stephen, and Pope Pius IX, are buried at the basilica. Continue to the magnificent Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from Peter to Francis. Continue to visit the Catacombs of St. Sebastian. Independent lunch. Return to hotel to freshen-up. freshen-up.

This afternoon, we'll continue to the **Pontifical North American College to celebrate Mass. Our gala dinner will be at Scarpone restaurant in Rome.** Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and friendship and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman setting with wine. Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 12 Friday, September 26: Return from Rome

After breakfast at our hotel, we will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for our return flight home. Arrive on the same day.

Travel insurance is recommended as protection for cancellations due to medical reasons (illness or injury). Travel insurance payments are non-refundable. Tour participation is nontransferable. Names cannot be changed on roster or airline tickets. All refund requests are subject to cancellation terms set forth above. Costs for tour services that are not utilized are non-refundable. LATE RESERVATIONS: Enrollments received after the deposit deadline are subject to confirmation. Late fees and a possible increase in airfare may apply.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Each traveler is solely responsible for carrying a valid passport and ascertaining knowledge of current entry/exit requirements. **U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date.** Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in 2025, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (ie., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: The travel package does not include airfare. Optional group airfare from Evansville will be offered as an add-on once a group booking and airfare have been confirmed. Flight itinerary and carrier to be advised in October 2024. You will have 3 to 5 days to either accept or decline the group airfare offering. If you choose to purchase independent flights, PWT will not be held responsible if you cancel your participation in the tour for any reason. It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT. PLEASE NOTE, under group contracts, seat selection is not permitted. If you choose to purchase the group airfare, requests for seat preferences (window or aisle) may be made when you check in for the flight. There is no guarantee that requests will be honored. The Land Only package does not include group airfare. It is the traveler's responsibility to book airline tickets independently if the group airfare add-on is declined. Passenger(s) who purchase airfare independently, or deviate from the group itinerary, are responsible for their own transfers to/from the hotel/airport. ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested, with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of

If the insurance premium is included with your deposit, the passenger will be covered for **pre-existing conditions.** The insurance plan can be purchased at any time thereafter, excluding coverage for pre-existing conditions, until final payment has been made.
