

This pilgrimage entails a lot of walking, stairs, hills, cobblestone roads, etc. Participants must be medically and physically fit for this type of travel. DAY 1 Thursday, March 20: Depart for Italy

Depart Newark Liberty International or New York JFK International Airport for Italy. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the transatlantic flight.

DAY 2 Friday, March 21: Welcome to Rome! | Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls

Arrive at Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way tour manager as we exit from Customs and Baggage Claim. As our hotel rooms unlikely to be available this early, board our private touring bus and we'll be on our way to visit the magnificent Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls. Enter through the "holy door" of the basilica. The basilica was built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. After being destroyed by fire in 1823, it was rebuilt on the original plan of early Christian churches. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from St. Peter to Pope Francis. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls.** Independent lunch.

Check-in at our hotel. Free afternoon to enjoy Rome on your own.

Welcome dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 3 Saturday, March 22: Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica | Vatican Museums & Sistine Chapel

After an early breakfast, we will be transferred to St. Peter's Basilica. Enter through the Holy Door to receive a plenary indulgence. Celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter (subject to confirmation) or one of the Grotto Chapels. After Mass we will visit one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk through the Sistine Chapel and see the frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End our morning with a more detailed guided tour of St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Pray at the tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. In your free time, you may wish to return to the Vatican Crypt to pray near the tomb of St. Peter. Independent lunch.

Free afternoon to explore the sights, sounds, and tastes of Rome all on your own! Perhaps you'll buy religious articles in preparation for the Papal Blessing at the audience on Wednesday. Or treat yourself to a leisurely multi-course lunch in a quaint trattoria. Visit the Colosseum or the beautiful and lively Piazza Navona, with time to browse through the artists' stalls to buy a painting and sample one of Rome's most famous products, a tartufo at the Gelateria Tre Scalini. This is the time to visit the local shops and street vendors. Rome is yours! Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B)

DAY 4 Sunday, March 23: Ancient Rome | Papal Basilicas of Rome Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our morning with a visit to the Church of St. Peter in Chains to see the original chains in which St. Peter was brought captive to Rome and the statue of Moses, one of Michelangelo's greatest masterpieces. Continue to the ancient Roman Forum. See the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to the outside of the Colosseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue to St. Peter's Square in time for the 12:00 p.m. Papal Blessing. Independent lunch.

The main distinction of the Papal Basilicas is that they each have a special "holy door" which are opened only during Jubilee years. Continue our day with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (432-440 A.D.). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics depicting scenes from the Old Testament. View relics of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem and the high altar, which contains the remains of St. Matthew the Evangelist. View the icon Salus Populi Romani, Protectress of the Roman People, believed to be painted by St. Luke. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Mary Major. Continue to the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, the first Christian church to be consecrated. It was founded by Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and home to popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. From there we'll pass by the Holy Stairs, said to be the steps on which Christ walked on His way to Pilate's palace. You can go up on your knees as thousands of pilgrims have done in reverently recalling the sufferings of Christ. Then, we will visit the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, which houses fragments of the true cross brought to Rome by St. Helena, mother of Constantine. (B,D) Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 5 Monday, March 24: Assisi | Sites of St. Francis & St. Clare

After early breakfast at our hotel. We'll leave Rome for Assisi. Upon arrival, we will celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis. After Mass, our local guide will take us to explore the basilica complex, which is actually composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower basilica dates from 1228 to 1230 and is richly decorated with beautiful stained-glass windows and paintings by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper basilica, built from 1230 to 1253, we will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint. Continue to the Basilica of St. Clare to view her remains and see the miraculous Crucifix. Group lunch included in Assisi.

After lunch, we'll also have the opportunity to visit Piazza del Comune, Chiesa Nuova, the home and cloth workshops of Pietro Bernadone and Lady Pica (St. Francis' parents), the home of St. Clare's parents, the Bishop's Palace, or the Sanctuary of the Renunciation, a part of the Church of St. Mary Major. The tomb of Bl. Carlo Acutis is in a sanctuary located on the spot where a young St. Francis of Assisi is said to have cast off his rich clothes in favor of a poor habit. Pray near the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis, who had a passionate devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Next, we'll visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great basilica built in 1569 and crowned by Alessi's magnificent dome. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered; the place where Clare received the habit from Francis; and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where the Saint died. We will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. A stop will be made en route back to Rome for an independent dinner and refreshments. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,L)

DAY 6 Tuesday, March 25: Monte Cassino | Wine Tasting and Gala

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Rome to visit the 5th century Abbey of Monte Cassino, the cradle of the Benedictine Order, founded by St. Benedict in 529. **Celebrate Mass at the Abbey.** Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we will continue to Castelli Romani to enjoy a wine tasting of the region and festive meal at Tenuta Santa Benedetta. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and taste wonderful Mediterranean cuisine in a Roman setting. Return to Rome.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

DAY 7 Wednesday, March 26: Papal Audience | Walking Tour of Historic Rome

Early breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, enter the heart of Christendom for an audience with our Holy Father. Pope Francis will greet pilgrims, deliver his message, pray the Pater Noster, and bless religious articles. Independent lunch.

After lunch, we'll go on a walking tour and experience the best of ancient Rome. Begin at the Pantheon. Built more than 1,800 years ago, the magnificent Pantheon still stands as a reminder of the great Roman Empire. The name Pantheon refers to the building's original function as a temple for the gods. When approaching the front of the Pantheon we can still see the original Latin dedication by Marcus Agrippa. Continue to the Church of San Luigi dei Francesi to see the stunning interior, which is home to a trio of Caravaggio masterpieces. Then we'll walk to the Trevi fountain and Piazza di Spagna, one of the most famous squares in Rome. See the Fontanna della Barcaccia (Fountain of the Old Boat) in the middle of the piazza and enjoy the view from the famous Spanish Steps. Celebrate Mass at the Church of Sant'Agnese in Agone in Piazza Navona.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

DAY 8 Thursday, March 27: Return from Rome

After breakfast, we will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for our return flight home. (B)

Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

PAYMENT: All payments will be accepted in the form of check, money order, or debit/credit card. Peter's Way Tours (PWT) reserves the right to increase the package price or reduce services should there be an escalation in the Euro valuation over the U.S. Dollar in excess of 3% from print date. If a final payment is not received by the balance deadline, PWT reserves the right to cancel your reservation. A \$50.00 late fee and possible increase in airfare may apply for late payments. Personal checks will not be accepted within 30 days of departure. If the bank returns a personal check, a \$50.00 processing fee will apply and subsequent payments must be made in the form of money order, certified bank check, or debit/credit card. PWT collects funds on travelers' behalf and remits those funds to suppliers. PWT has no liability for suppliers' acts or omissions. By signing this enrollment form, you agree you will not initiate a chargeback against PWT for any supplier's failure to refund or provide credit due to a forced cancellation of services.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: All tour deposits and payments are non-refundable upon receipt. If you cancel from 99 days prior to departure up to the day of departure, all payments are non-refundable, including departure taxes & fuel surcharges, single supplement, deviation fees, travel insurance payments, or other costs. Travel insurance is recommended as protection for cancellations due to medical reasons (illness or injury). Travel insurance payments are non-refundable. Tour participation is non-transferable. Names cannot be changed on roster or airline tickets. All refund requests are subject to cancellation terms set forth above. Costs for tour services that are not utilized are non-refundable. We strongly recommend purchasing travel insurance in order to protect your tour package investment. Please read all details very carefully under TRAVEL INSURANCE.

LATE RESERVATIONS: Enrollments received after the deposit deadline are subject to confirmation. Late fees and a possible increase in airfare may apply.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Each traveler is solely responsible for carrying a valid passport and ascertaining knowledge of current entry/exit requirements. **U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date.**Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in 2025, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (ie., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: The travel package does not include airfare. Optional group airfare from Newark or New York JFK will be offered as an addon once a group booking and airfare have been confirmed. Flight itinerary and carrier to be advised in May 2024. You will have 3 to 5 days to either accept or decline the group airfare offering. If you choose to purchase independent flights, PWT will not be held responsible if you cancel your participation in the tour for any reason. It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT. PLEASE NOTE, under group contracts, seat selection is not permitted. If you choose to purchase the group airfare, requests for seat preferences (window or aisle) may be made when you check in for the flight. There is no guarantee that requests will be honored. PWT cannot submit special seat requests on behalf of any passenger. Group reservations may not be accessed online for advance check-in/boarding passes/seat assignments. If seat selection is a condition that affects your decision to travel, it is suggested that you book your airline arrangements independently.

LAND ONLY TOUR PRICE: The Land Only package price is \$2,995.00 per person sharing a twin room (\$100 cash discount will be applied if all payments are made by check). The Land Only package does not include group airfare. It is the traveler's responsibility to book airline tickets independently if the group airfare add-on is declined. Passenger(s) who purchase airfare independently, or deviate from the group itinerary, are responsible for their own transfers to/from the hotel/airport. However, if your flights coordinate with the group booking arrangements, you are welcome to utilize the group transfer(s). If you purchase your own airline transportation and the group does not materialize or you cancel for any reason, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost of your airfare.

DEVIATIONS & ITINERARY CHANGES: PWT is pleased to assist clients with special requests. Group airfare deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 100 days prior to departure. A deviation fee of \$150 plus any increase in airfare or additional fees may also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact PWT for more information.

TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Overseas round-trip airport transfers are included for passengers who purchase the land only package plus the group airfare add-on for the group tour dates. Porterage of one piece of luggage at hotels throughout your tour is included. Peter's Way Tours cannot be held liable for any misplaced or lost luggage. It is the passenger's responsibility to make sure their luggage travels with them the entirety of the trip.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested, with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$895 will apply. We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

MEALS: Breakfast daily plus one (1) group lunch and four (4) dinners, including a wine tasting and festive meal at Tenuta Santa Benedetta.

GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES: Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Although voluntary, for good work we recommend €4 Euro per person per day for your tour manager; €2 Euro per person per day for your bus driver; and €1.50 Euro per tour for local guides. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the package price. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave €1 Euro per person for the wait staff after each meal and €1 Euro per person per day for housekeeping.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: Passengers must be medically and physically fit for travel and ensure that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others. Most pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, stairs, hills, cobblestone roads, etc. Tour buses are not equipped with wheelchair ramps. A traveler who requires special assistance must notify PWT and must be accompanied by a travel companion who will provide proper help. PWT shall not be held responsible if we are unable to accommodate passengers with special needs, or for the denial of services to a passenger by any carrier, hotel, restaurant, or other independent suppliers.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants purchase insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for nonrefundable payments, damaged luggage, or trip interruption. PWT offers an optional Passenger Travel Protection Plan. These benefits and services help ensure the well-being of the passenger while traveling worldwide. The insurance premium is based on total package price, including optional group airfare (if purchased), taxes, fuel surcharges, single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc (see chart below). If the insurance premium is included with your deposit, the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions. The insurance plan can be purchased at any time thereafter, excluding coverage for pre-existing conditions, until final payment has been made. Plan payments will not be accepted after final payment has been made. All plan payments are non**refundable.** If you choose to extend your stay or plan a pre-tour program, travel insurance can be purchased for an additional \$4.00 per day. Additional coverage needs to be requested. The insurance plan will not automatically be extended. The insurance plan will only cover pre-paid arrangements made through PWT.
