DAY 1 Monday, June 16: Depart for Greece

Depart for Greece. Soar into the evening sky on our overnight flight to Thessaloniki. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B) and beverages will be served on board the flight.

DAY 2 Tuesday, June 17: Arrive in Thessaloniki

Arrive at Thessaloniki International Airport. We will make our way to the baggage claim area, collect our luggage, and proceed to the arrival hall, where we will be greeted by our English-speaking tour guide and assisted to the bus. Board our private touring bus and be on our way for an orientation tour of Thessaloniki. St. Paul preached in the main synagogue of Thessaloniki and wrote two letters to the Thessalonians. Here we will see the triumphal Arch of Galerius spanning the ancient Via Egnatia, constructed to honor the Roman Emperor Galerius following his victory over the Persians. If time permits, we will also visit the Byzantine Church of Hosios David and the Rotunda of St. George, which features early Christian mosaics. **Celebrate Mass** and settle into our hotel. **Evening Prayer.**

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Thessaloniki. (D)

DAY 3 Wednesday, June 18: Thessaloniki | Philippi | Baptistery of Lydia | Kavala

Breakfast at our hotel. **Morning Prayer.** This morning, we will tour Thessaloniki, the second largest city in Greece and the capital of Macedonia. During our walking tour, our guide will explain the architecture, churches, and monasteries of Thessaloniki's Byzantine tradition, including the Church of Hagia Sophia with its eighth-century mosaics, the small Church of St. Panteleimon, the Church of Acheiropoietos, the Church of Panagia Chalkeon, and the Church of St. Demetrius, patron saint of the city. After our visit, we will travel to Philippi, where Paul established the first Christian community in Europe. We will **celebrate Mass** at the river, where Paul spoke to a group of women and baptized Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth. She was the first European convert. We then visit the Roman Forum where Paul cast a spirit out of a fortune-telling woman and the ruins of the prison where Paul and Silas were held in chains and miraculously released. We will also visit the new Baptistery of St. Lydia.

After his stay in Philippi, Paul wrote a letter filled with joyful gratitude to the Philippians. Independent lunch. We will continue on to the city of Kavala, the ancient Port of Neapolis. After being urged to travel to Macedonia, Paul, Silas, Luke, and Timothy crossed into Europe, arriving by sea at this port. At the Church of St. Nikolaus, we will view a monument entitled *The Arrival of the Apostle Paul in Neapolis of Philippi*, honoring his first steps in Europe. After enjoying this city by the sea, return to Thessaloniki. **Evening Prayer.**

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Thessaloniki. (B,D)

DAY 4 Thursday, June 19: Veria | Meteora | Kammerna Vourla

Breakfast at our hotel. **Morning Prayer.** This morning, we will leave Thessaloniki for Vergina (Aigai), the ancient royal capital of Macedon. Explore the remarkable underground Museum of the Royal Tombs. Continue to Veria (Biblical Bereoa), a charming town with a Jewish quarter and dozens of Byzantine churches. Paul visited here twice, where both Jews and Greeks eagerly received his message. See the "bema" where Paul preached, marked with a monument of mosaics and a nearby statue in his honor. **Celebrate outdoor Mass at the Bema.** Independent lunch.

This afternoon, continue through the Greek countryside past Mount Olympus, legendary home to the Greek gods, to the Meteora Monasteries. Hiding in caves from the Ottoman invaders in the 11th century, the invading armies forced the monks to move their settlements higher up on the rocks until they were unreachable. Meteora means "suspended in the air," as the beautiful monasteries were built by bringing materials and food supplies using ladders and baskets. We will visit one of the Byzantine monasteries. Perched on top of steep rocks and surrounded by breathtaking scenery, they hold priceless manuscripts, artifacts, and paintings. (Reaching one of the monasteries requires walking over uneven terrain and many steps.) We will visit an icon workshop in the area, where we will see how icons are made. We will then continue to Kammerna Vourla for hotel check-in. **Evening Prayer.**

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Kammerna Vourla. (B,D)

DAY 5 Friday, June 20: Aegean Greek Islands Cruise | Mykonos | Sail to Kusadasi

Breakfast at our hotel. **Morning Prayer.** This morning, we will be transferred to Piraeus

to **celebrate Mass at St. Paul Church.** After Mass, we will travel to Piraeus Harbor in time for the 11:30 a.m. boarding of the cruise ship *Celestyal Discovery*. Lunch on board *Celestyal Discovery*.

Arrive in Mykonos. Enjoy this paradise island known for its nightlife, beautiful beaches, boutiques, and cuisine. This Greek island has hundreds of tiny chapels dotting the landscape with sheep grazing in the shadow of whitewashed windmills. While on Mykonos, you are free to explore on your own. **Evening Prayer.**

Dinner and overnight aboard *Celestyal Discovery*. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 Saturday, June 21: Kusadasi | Patmos | Overnight Sail to Crete

Breakfast and **Morning Prayer.** Disembark in Kusadasi and travel by bus to Ephesus, the best preserved of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev. 2.1-7). We will visit the ancient city with its impressive temples, marble streets, library, agoras, baths, and theater that seats 24,000 people. We will also visit the House of the Virgin Mary. One tradition says this is the place where St. John brought Mary after the Death and Resurrection of Jesus. **Celebrate Mass at the House of the Virgin Mary.**

Sail to Patmos. Arrive near the island of Patmos and transfer by boat to the "Holy Island" known as the site where St. John wrote his apocalyptic Revelation during his exile from the Roman Empire. The cave where St. John lived is near the site of the Monastery of the Apocalypse. We will visit the Monastery of St. John, which houses priceless icons and is built on one of the island's highest points. Here we pray at the site where John wrote the Book of Revelation. The silver niches in the wall mark the seat and ledge that St. John used as a desk. **Evening Prayer.**

All meals and overnight aboard *Celestyal Discovery*. (B,L,D)

DAY 7 Sunday, June 22: Heraklion (Crete) | Santorini | Overnight Sail to Piraeus

Breakfast and **Morning Prayer.** Arrive in Heraklion, the capital of Crete (shore excursion included). Afternoon sail to Santorini. Arrive in Santorini, the island which some believe to be the site of the lost city of Atlantis. (Shore excursion included). Spend time in the village of Fira, perched on the rim of a crater formed by a volcano that destroyed the island in about 1630 B.C. Take the cable car to the top or ride a donkey up a winding path. There are many interesting shops, and it is easy to find a cafe or taverna that has a spectacular view.

Evening Prayer and Mass on board the cruise ship. This evening, we will sail overnight to Piraeus Harbor in Athens.

All meals and overnight aboard *Celestyal Discovery*. (B,L,D)

DAY 8 Monday, June 23: Piraeus | Corinth | Athens

Dock at Piraeus. After an early breakfast and **Morning Prayer**, disembark and begin our day with an excursion to Corinth (Acts 18.1-18). Stop briefly en route to see the famous man-made Corinth Canal, named one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World. Continue to Corinth, where St. Paul wrote the First Letter to the Thessalonians and, most likely, his Letter to the Romans. Explore the extensive archeological site, including the Temple of Apollo, the Roman Agora, and the Bema—where Paul's enemies brought him before Gallio. See the pavement inscription of Erastus, the Roman Lechaion Road, the lower Fountain of Peirene, and the Acrocorinth, an 1,800-foot hill that rises majestically above the ancient city. In the first century, there were many shrines and temples dominated by the Temple of Aphrodite. It was also the location of a series of fortifications built during ancient and medieval times that continued through the successive chain of Franco, Byzantine, Venetian, and Turkish supremacy. **Celebrate outdoor Mass in Corinth.**

Independent lunch. After lunch, we will continue to Athens for hotel check-in. **Evening Prayer.**

Overnight at our hotel in Athens. (B,D)

DAY 9 Tuesday, June 24: Athens | Farewell Dinner

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with **Morning Prayer and Mass at the Roman Catholic Cathedral of St. Dennis or at Sacred Heart Church.**

After Mass, we will explore the most famous site in Greece. Here Paul arrived at one of the most glorious cities in the world, though he was deeply distressed to see it full of idols. He preached to the Jews in the synagogue and debated with philosophers in the marketplace. Seeing an altar dedicated "to an unknown god," Paul proclaimed the God whom they worshipped as unknown. We will view the ancient Agora, the political, commercial, social, religious, and cultural center of Athenian life during the first century. Driving through the modern city, view the House of Parliament on Syntagma Square, the Temple of Olympian Zeus, and Panathenaic Stadium, the beautifully marbled multi-purpose stadium and site of the first modern-era Olympic Games in 1896. Independent lunch.

Late afternoon, we will visit the Plaka, a lively historic neighborhood nestled at the foot of the Acropolis. **Feast on local cuisine and enjoy fine wine in a traditional tavern with Greek entertainment. Evening Prayer.**

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Athens. (B,D)

DAY 10 Wednesday, June 25: Return to the USA

Morning Prayer and Mass (location to be determined). After breakfast, we will be transferred to Athens International Airport for our return flight home.

This pilgrimage entails a lot of walking, stairs, hills, cobblestone roads, etc.

Participants must be medically and physically fit for this type of travel.

Package inclusions do not always meet the special needs of travelers with limited mobility or severe allergies. If you have concerns or health issues, please discuss with Peter's Way Tours before enrolling in the pilgrimage.

Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

PAYMENT: All payments will be accepted in the form of check, money order, or debit/credit card. **Peter's Way Tours (PWT)** reserves the right to increase the package price or reduce services should there be an escalation in the Euro valuation over the U.S. Dollar in excess of 3% from print date. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). AIR TRANSPORTATION: This travel package includes round-trip economy class airfare from New York. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Estimated departure taxes & fuel surcharges are subject to increase prior to ticketing. All flights are booked under one itinerary. If a traveler does not travel on any one of the flights in the proper sequence, the rest of the reservation will be automatically canceled by the airline.
